

Proof of English language proficiency for a master's degree in International Management of Forest Industries

The degree programme is delivered in English, so applicants will need to provide evidence of their proficiency in English at level B2 of the Council of Europe's Common European Framework of Reference for languages.

The following certificates are accepted as proof of language proficiency:

- » UNICert® Level II English certificate
- » TOEFL: Test of English as a Foreign Language
Level: online test, min. 72 points
- » TOEIC: Test of English for International Communication
Level: listening, min. 400 points; reading, min. 450 points
- » IELTS: International English Testing System
Level: IELTS Academic, min. 5.5 points
- » TELC English
Level: B2 School, Business or Technical
- » ESOL Cambridge University: English for Speakers of Other Languages
Level:
 - Cambridge English: First (FCE)
 - Certificate in English Language Skills: Vantage
 - Cambridge English: Business Vantage
- » CET: College English Test
Level: Band 6
- » Pearson PTE Academic: min. 59 points
- » German (Fach-)Abiturzeugnis, as long as it provides explicit evidence of a proficiency in English at level B2 or higher

Proof is provided by submitting the respective certificate, grade report or other evidence (e.g. university entrance qualification in the relevant language; completed degree in which at least 50% of the modules completed were in English) equivalent to those already mentioned. The Examining Committee of the University's Language Centre will decide on the equivalence of any other evidence provided.

Applicants whose native language in their home country is English or who have attended an English-language school for six years do not need to additionally prove the English-language level with a certificate.
